Not only will there be back-to-back lectures with demonstrations, tours to the Royal Tyrrell Museum in Drumheller and Rocky Mountains, and much more, Vulcan County is also part of the plan.

A special, all-day tour has been planned for Wednesday, July 4, to see both the Majorville Medicine Wheel and Carmangay Sundial, with bonus stops, too.

Sky watch

On Saturday, June 16, look northwest-west at dusk to see Venus next to a thin crescent moon.

On Monday, June 18, look northwest-west at dusk to see Regulus, the brightest star in the constellation of Leo, next to a crescent moon. Thursday, June 21 is officially the start of summer in the northern

hemisphere. We will have 16 hours

and 33 minutes of daylight on June

21, when the sun rises at 5:21 a.m. and sets at 9:54 p.m.

On Wednesday, June 27, after sunset in the southeast, Saturn and a full moon will be up all night before setting together at dawn in the southwest.

Public events

A guided tour to the Majorville Medicine Wheel and Carmangay sundial takes place on Wednesday, July 4. You can't buy this type of tour anywhere, so take it while you can. The cost is to be finalized as it's on a shared basis, but go to rascga2018. ca/schedule/first-nations-stone-cairn-site-tour for details.

As a bonus, we will also visit the Blackfoot Crossing Historical Park on the Siksika Reserve and the Carmangay tipi ring site. The day finishes with a barbecue on a ranch. Space is limited and expected to sell out fast, so book your spot today!
